



Expanded Food & Hygiene Pantry

Our comprehensive pantry includes cleaning & hygiene supplies, child & adult diapers as well as fruits & vegetables.

8,864 Snack Packs Distributed to 943 self-identified unsheltered individuals

- 22,368 duplicated individuals received groceries
 & hygiene supplies (a 24.8% increase from 2023)
- 7,141 distinct individuals were served through our pantry
- 547 distinct households received Homebound Deliveries
- Homebound senior clients also received Christmas goodie bags


Christmas HOPE Tree



Galveston Diaper Bank

Distributed 2,002,998 Baby & **Adult Incontinence Supplies**

The Galveston Diaper Bank partnered with St. Vincent's House in order to be more impactful in reaching individuals and families in need. We served 897 distinct babies and 327 adults & seniors received incontinence supplies.

Drive Thru Narcan Dispensary

655 Narcan Distributed

St. Vincent's House became the 1st Drive Through Narcan Dispensary in Galveston, making Narcan easily accessible to the community with two FREE access points, including 24/7 access in the back drive-up alley.

Galveston County is the #2 place for Fentanyl related deaths per capita in Texas. Recently,

Galveston County has seen a 50% decline in overdose deaths thanks to community support and increased Narcan availability with St. Vincent's House distributing an average of 55 doses monthly. Narcan is the only medication that can save a life in a matter of seconds!

Every Saturday, this group of amazing volunteer dentists provides essential dental extractions and referrals for specialized treatments, **last year** serving a total of 279 clients!




Comprehensive Vision Program



After enduring months of hardship, Sarah came to St. Vincent's House as a last resort, seeking help with rent and utilities. Sarah had no choice but to take a leave from work to care for her sick mother and twin sister, Susan, who has cerebral palsy. After her mother's death, she became her sister's sole caregiver. Overwhelmed, Sarah's Case Manager, Mariana, provided a plan of support, including assistance with rent, utilities, food, adult incontinence supplies for her sister, healthcare, and job search resources. After months of effort, she secured a remote job but lacked equipment. Because of your generosity, St. Vincent's House was able to surprise her with the necessary supplies to get her back on her feet. Grateful to have found this life-changing assistance, Sarah shared, "You're truly a blessing in me and my sister's life."
